#### Birding Extremadura and Casa Rural El Recuerdo

## Spring Holiday 22<sup>nd</sup> - 29<sup>th</sup> April 2012

#### **Itinerary**

22<sup>nd</sup> April: Pick-up at Madrid airport and transfer to Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

**23<sup>rd</sup> April**: Monfragüe National Park

24<sup>th</sup> April: Plains south of Zorita, Moheda Alta and Guadalupe

25<sup>th</sup> April: Plains near Santa Marta de Magasca, Talaván and Trujillo

**26<sup>th</sup> April**: Alange Reservoir and Mérida

27<sup>th</sup> April: Guadiloba and Valdesalor reservoir, Los Barruecos and Belén

28<sup>th</sup> April: Arrocampo reservoir

**29**<sup>th</sup> **April**: Valdecañas followed by return to Madrid airport for night flight.

The weather was varied, often overcast and with generally fresh windy conditions and plenty of rain during the second half of the week.

# 22<sup>nd</sup> April

The afternoon flight from London Gatwick arrived early and soon we were leaving the outskirts of Madrid, making a late but excellent lunch stop at the Esparteras bar along the A5 motorway. After that is was non-stop to Extremadura and arrival late afternoon at Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

# 23<sup>rd</sup> April

The day started sunny but became overcast during the afternoon, with fresh winds all day. We headed north from Casa Rural El Recuerdo, passing through the small historic town of Trujillo which stands on an impressive granite outcrop and continuing northwards. Our route crossed an extensive landscape of *dehesa* or wood pasture, stretching as far as the eye could see. We entered the Monfragüe National Park from the north, through beautiful cork oak parkland. We then pulled in to park near the viewpoint Portilla del Tiétar. This is a wonderful spot, with a rocky crag beside the Tiétar river, with wooded hillsides. We were rewarded with magnificent views of a female **Eagle Owl** perched in a cork oak tree and her two chicks at their nest nearby. We also enjoyed excellent views of a **Spanish Imperial Eagle**.

We stopped just down the road to see a **Black Stork** at her nest, with a pair of **Egyptian Vultures** nearby. We had lunch amongst pines looking out over the Tiétar river, with another **Griffon Vulture** colony nearby.

We then took a short walk beside the Tajo Rover, watching **Alpine Swifts** and a **Bonelli's Eagle** passing low overhead. We completed our visit at the Salto del Gitano viewpoint, looking across at the impressive Peña Falcón rock face. As well as the numerous **Griffon Vultures**, we also watched a **Peregrine**, **Blue Rock Thrush** and **Black Redstart**.

### 24<sup>th</sup> April

It felt colder today, rather windy but generally sunny, with the wind abating by late afternoon. We visited the plains south of the town of Zorita enjoying excellent views of displaying **Great Bustards**, as well as **Little Bustards**. Close by was a party of **Black-bellied Sandgrouse** as well as a group of 13 **Whimbrel**. We then headed onto the rice-growing area, although the fields were mainly ploughed (a few remaining as stubble) and mostly all dry. **Cetti's Warblers** were heard frequently and we saw several **Marsh Harriers**, as well as parties of **Red Avadavats** and a fine **Roller**.

After coffee at Obando, we stopped at a small pool and found a group of waders including **Lapwing**, **Little Stint**, and a **Collared Pratincole**. There was a noisy colony of **Spanish Sparrows** in the middle of a bramble thicket – a wonderful sight. We had lunch nearby at Moheda Alta after visiting the Crane Information Centre there.

We then drove up to Guadalupe to visit the Basilica of the famous Monastery. There followed coffee in the delightful small square of the town, where a massive stone font stands, used in 1496 for the baptism of people from South America who returned with Christopher Columbus. We then drove to a high viewpoint above the town where we had an excellent view of Guadalupe nestling in the tree-covered hills. We ended with a short walk beside the Ruercas river near Cañamero, where we saw **Rock Bunting**.

That evening we took a stroll along the lane at dusk and were rewarded with the lovely sound of the quite, gently hoot of **Long-eared Owls**, and watched one flying around twice. We also heard **Scops Owl** and **Barn Owl**.

## 25<sup>th</sup> April

It was a windy and overcast day. We explored the area to the west of Trujillo. Stopping first in open plains where we quickly found a flock of **Pin-tailed Sandgrouse**. Although distant, their bright orange breasts contrasting with their whiter bellies, as well as their spangled upperparts could be seen very well. A little bit further on a **Booted Eagle** drifted overhead and we found small group of **Black-bellied Sandgrouse** in a field, albeit rather distant. We stopped briefly north of the village of Santa Marta de Magasca, where we had rather distant views of a **Golden Eagle**, before returning south to another area of plains where we watched **Montagu's Harriers**, **Short-toed Lark** and a delightful **Little Owl** peering out to us from a nestbox.

We stopped beside the Talaván reservoir where there were good numbers of Great Crested and Little Grebe and then stopped for lunch beside the River

Almonte where we had wonderful views of **Cirl Bunting** and **Egyptian Vultures**. We then returned to Trujillo to visit the medieval part of the town, starting in the Main Square, walking up to the Moorish castle and returning through the narrow streets between churches and old palaces, taking a stop to enter the magnificent church of Santa María.

## 26<sup>th</sup> April

It was a wet and overcast day, with fairly persistent rain throughout the morning.

We drove south-west to the capital of Extremadura: Mérida. Here we visited first the famous Roman Theatre and Amphitheatre, followed by a very rewarding visit to the excellent Museum of Roman Art. From there we visited the Temple of Diana and then the Roman Bridge, the longest such structure in the world. It spans the Guadiana river and from the bridge we had superb views of a pair of **Little Bittern** as well as **Penduline Tit** and a family of **Purple Swamphen**. After lunch of suckling pig and chorizo in an old restaurant in the city centre, we drove down to the Alange reservoir. Walking along the rather muddy path beside the reservoir we saw a fine male **Black Wheatear** as well as **Gull-billed Terns** over the water.

# 27<sup>th</sup> April

It was another wet and overcast day. We headed west towards Cáceres, making a brief visit first to the Guadiloba reservoir (where we saw **Great Spotted Cuckoo**) and then the Valdesalor reservoir before stopping beside the large White Storks' colony on platforms outside Malpartida de Cáceres. On the other side of the town is the National Natural Monument of Los Barruercos, one of the few places where the storks are nesting on top of granite boulders. We enjoyed a walk around the area, seeing a variety of birds including a smart **Grey Plover** in breeding plumage, a **Ringed Plover**, as well as **Booted Eagle**. After lunch in a bar at the edge of the town, we then spent the rest of the afternoon on the Belén plains east of Trujillo, where we saw **Great Bustard** and had some excellent views of **Bee-eaters**. Parties of **Lesser Kestrel** were feeding over the grasslands, making the most of a respite in the weather.

# 28<sup>th</sup> April

Despite another wet day, we had a very productive visit to the Arrocampo reservoir, where the reed and *Typha*-fringed banks provide excellent habitat for many species. Taking advantage of the hides to shelter from the rain, we saw a variety of heron species including **Purple** and **Grey Heron**, **Great Egret**, **Black-crowned Night Heron**, **Spoonbill** and **Little Bittern**. A **Purple Heron** caused much interest on account of the size of reeds it was carrying to its nest, some over twice its length! **Savi's Warblers** sang almost continuously, a **Melodious Warbler** foraged nearby and a cheeky **Cetti's Warbler** perched right out in the open a number of times right in front of where we were sitting. Sightings were also had of **Black-winged Kite** and **Marsh Harrier**. Exploring farmland to the west, we had views of an Otter swimming in a small pool as well as seeing a

**Spotted Flycatcher**. The little bar in the town of Saucedilla proved an excellent refuge from the rain as well as a good spot for fried chorizo roll!

A brief stop was had in Trujillo to buy chorizos to take back home.

### 29th April

Another wet day and we left Casa Rural El Recuerdo at about 9.30 to return to Madrid. We made a stop in a valley below the dam of the Valdecañas reservoir, where despite the poor weather a range of birds were in song: Golden Oriole, Nightingale, Blackcap and Wren amongst others. After an early lunch stop at Las Esparteras bar, we reached the airport shortly after 13.15.

The holiday did not focus on maximising the number of species seen and time was also devoted to visiting cultural centres such as Trujillo, Guadalupe and Mérida. Notwithstanding this, plus inclement weather during much of the week, a good total of **127** species were recorded:

- **19. Egyptian Vulture** Seen in Monfragüe and River Almonte.
- 20. Griffon Vulture21. Black VultureSeen almost every day.
- **22.Short-toed Eagle** Seen on plains south of Zorita and River Almonte.
- **23.Marsh Harrier** Seen at Arrocampo and on the rice fields.
- 24. Montagu's Harrier Seen on several days.
