Itinerary

12th June 2016: Transfer from Madrid with stop near Valdecañas Dam

Trip Report

12th June 2016: Transfer from Madrid with stop near Valdecañas Dam

Julie and Geoff were met by Martin at Madrid Airport at 11.00 and following a stop for a snack *en* route to Extremadura we then paused at a small valley near the Valdecañas Dam to start our search for butterflies, dragonflies and birds. **False llex Hairstreaks**

were active on the *retama* broom, whilst we found a resting **Western Spectre** to the background sound of **Golden Orioles**.

13th June 2016: Castañar del Ibor

We spent the whole day taking a short walk (we got no further than 1.6 km from the start of the track!) through an area of mixed habitats (a stream, smallholdings, sweet chestnut groves and Pyrenean Oak) close to the village of Castañar del Ibor. As the morning warmed up so did the butterflies and they detained us at several stages, especially in a wonderful clearing, as well as at crossings of the stream. We recorded no fewer than 35 species of butterfly during the day there, including **Amanda's Blue**, **Southern White Admiral** and **Spotted Fritillary**.

14th June 2016: Monfragüe National Park

We started the day at the castle in Monfragüe enjoying superb views of **White-rumped Swifts**, passing a tremendously close range. We then visited the succession of viewpoints across the park, spending most time in areas of mixed woodland where Strawberry Trees were growing. This tactic paid off with three sightings of **Two-tailed Pasha**, the most prolonged being at an area close to the Tagus River, where we also got good views of **Spanish Purple Hairstreak** as well as **Hawfinches** and other birds attracted to drinking pools there.

15th June 2016: Obando, Vegas Altas, Campo Lugar and Palazuelo

It was an unseasonally cold day and with little likelihood of finding many butterflies we focused on the birds of the rice fields and plains. The *dehesa* of Moheda Alta near

Obando was a breath-taking picture with the late spring flowers resilient against the tired dry grass stems.

On the rice fields we counted a total of 55 returning **Green Sandpipers**, as well as **Lapwing**, whilst **Black-winged Stilts** were nesting. We had superb views of **Collared Pratincoles**.

On the Campo Lugar plains we had the chance to get good views of **Rollers** as well as seeing four **Great Bustards**.



16th June 2016: Alcollarín Reservoir

We spent the whole day at the wonderful Alcollarín Reservoir. Although birds took a leading role: we relocated a **Red-knobbed Coot** that had been present here for several months and had sightings of a **Mediterranean Gull**, as well as four **Ferruginous Duck**, **Ruddy Shelduck** and well over a hundred pairs of **Great Crested Grebe**, there were some interesting butterflies as well. These included a few **African Grass Blue**. Also of African origin were dragonflies such as **Northern Banded Groundlings** and **Violet Dropwings**.

One of the most memorable however was something we hardly got a glimpse of: a **Great Reed Warbler** which sang and had a nest in a tiny clump of reed mace, and yet remained out of view for almost the whole time.

17th June 2016: Arrocampo, Tiétar River and La Vera

We left Casa Rural El Recuerdo early in order to make a first visit to the Arrocampo area. Here we had a very productive stop beside a small section of the marsh, watching a family of **Black-winged Kites**, as well as **Great Reed Warbler**, **Penduline Tit**, **Purple Heron** and **Lesser Kestrels**. At the main body of the marsh, we also saw **Little Bittern** and **Purple Swamphen**, as well as several sightings of **Long Skimmers**. Whilst enjoying a coffee in the village of Saucedilla, we watched a **Hobby**, seemingly feeding on high-flying insects.

We then headed north and made a stop at the Tiétar River in search of dragonflies. We had several sightings of **Purple Dropwing**, as well as **Epaulet Skimmer** and an ovipositing **Blue Emperor**.

We had lunch near the town of Jaraiz de la Vera and then stopped for a walk near its lake, which was productive for butterflies, such as **Ilex Hairstreak** and **Marbled Fritillary**.

It was the time to leave Extremadura and we crossed the Gredos Mountains at the Peak Pass, and entered the northern flanks of the mountains. We drove to our hotel (Hostel Almanzor at Navarredonda) in time to settle down before dinner.

18th June 2016: Gredos Mountains

After an early breakfast we headed straight to the Platforma, a high altitude site to leave the car and walk onto the open broom moorland. The sound of **Ortolan Buntings** was everywhere. We stopped at the edge of small valley where we started to get views of **Bluethroats**. We settled down and had excellent views of a pair. **Rufous-tailed Rock Thrushes** were also present in the area. All around us there were other birds such as **Northern Wheatear**, **Skylark** and **Water Pipit**.

We returned to the car and slowly descended making several stops on the way to look for birds and butterflies, making a prolonged stop in an area where a **Western Orphean Warbler** was singing, as well as **Woodlark**, and a range of butterflies included **Chestnut Heath**. After a mid-afternoon coffee, we had an excellent walk beside a tributary of the Tormes river, having great views of **Ocellated Lizards**.

In the evening **European Nightjars** churred from the pines beside the hotel and **Tawny Owls** were calling.

19th June 2016: Tormes River and return to Madrid

We checked out of the hotel and took a very productive walk on a track above the Tormes River, finding more species of butterfly as well as listening to an almost constant song from **Western Bonelli's Warblers**. By late morning it was time to start our return to Madrid, but on the way we stopped at the Peak pass to watch **Spanish Argus** close to the car park. We had been advised about a place to park and a track on the descent from the Pass and this we did. It was a most memorable finale to the holiday with sightings of additional species of butterfly, notably the **Black-veined White** and **Panoptes Blue**, as well as sightings of birds like **Crested Tit**. We then completed our descent to the hot dry plains of Castille La Mancha and then onto Madrid.
