TRIP REPORT

10th June 2022: Pick-up from Madrid and transfer to Casa Rural El Recuerdo

Martin met Koos at Terminal 2 of Madrid Airport just after 1pm and we headed out of Madrid via the ring-road and then onto the A5 motorway, which was quite busy with the Friday afternoon traffic. We stopped halfway on the journey for refreshments and then continued onto Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

11th June 2022: River Ibor, Castañar de Ibor, Ibores and River Almonte

We headed east to the Ibores, with a stop first at the River Ibor. Here we found an excellent selection of dragonflies, including **Western Demoiselle**, **Western** and **Yellow Clubtails** and both **Large** and Small **Pincertails**. We then took a walk to the east of the small town of Castañar de Ibor, up a small valley dominated by Pyrenean Oak and Sweet Chestnut trees. Here butterflies were coming to feed on nectar sources, including **Cleopatras**, **Amanda's Blue**, **Southern White Admiral**, **Cardinals**, **Spotted Fritillary** and **Iberian Marbled Whites**.

Our picnic spot gave us a superb view across the Ibor valley, across to rocky crags. South of there a road took us across a mountain pass and down to a meadow surrounded by Pyrenean Oak woodland. More butterflies were found here.

We completed the day visiting the River Almonte, near the village of Retamosa, where species such as **Small Bluetail** damselfly was seen.

12th June 2022: Monfragüe National Park, Puerto de Honduras and check-in hotel

We headed north from Trujillo, crossing the vast expanse of *dehesa* landscape dominated by evergreen Holm Oaks, to reach the Monfragüe National Park. We stopped at the magnificent viewpoint overlooking the vast cliff of Peña Falcón. Here there is a large colony of **Griffon Vultures**, as well as nesting **Black Stork**, **Peregrine** and **Egyptian Vulture**. Smaller birds like **Blue Rock Thrush** and **Rock Bunting** were also present. We had a short walk beside the Tajo River, watching birds such as **Hawfinches** coming to drink at small pools and butterflies such as **Spanish Purple Hairstreak**.

We continued our journey northwards, passing through Hervás and ascending to the Puerto de Honduras where we had our picnic. There was a nice selection of butterflies here, including **Pearly Heath**, **Niobe** and **Queen of Spain Fritillary**. On our descent through beautiful woodland we made a stop for more butterflies, including **Bath White** and a **Panoptes Blue**.

We checked into our hotel in Baños de Montemayor and whilst enjoying a beer on the terrace, watched a **Honey Buzzard** pass overhead.

13th June 2022: La Garganta

Koos had a very productive pre-breakfast walk, returning with a fine photo of a male **Golden Oriole**. After breakfast we made the short journey up to La Garganta, the second highest village in Extremadura, and onward to some beautiful small meadows at the border between Extremadura and Castille y Leon. It was a glorious morning and we were surrounded by butterflies most of the time. These included the extremely rare **Yellow-banded Skipper**, other skippers such as **Olive**, **Large Grizzled** and **Oberthür's Grizzled**, also **Niobe Fritillary**, **Knapweed Fritillary**, numerous **Marsh Fritillaries** and **Mazarine Blue**.



We had our picnic in the shade of pine trees and then walked into more open ground, but the temperature was now hitting 36°C, so we devoted the afternoon to looking for butterflies in shade, in a wooded valley to the south. Here there were species like **Southern White Admiral** and **Silver-washed Fritillaries**.

Back at the hotel, we found a **Geranium Bronze** in the geraniums growing at the entrance.

14th June 2022: Las Mestas, Alagón River, Candelario

After breakfast we drove north and then west to visit the remote village of Las Mestas. Although lying in Extremadura, it was best reached by heading through the southern edge of Salamanca province, through areas of woodland, small fields and old granite villages. At Las Mestas, we sat beside the Ladillar River and watched several dragonfly species, including **Splendid Cruisers**, **Orange-spotted Emeralds** and **Epaulet Skimmers**. A **Two-tailed Pasha** gave us fantastic views as it came to drink in a small patch of water close to us.



We then stopped beside the Alagón River where we saw **Great Banded Grayling** butterfly and a **White Featherleg** damselfly.

We returned to the east and the Sierra de Bejar, ascending to the viewpoint above the town of Candelario. Here we found several **Piedmont Ringlet** butterflies and watched a **Honey Buzzard** at close range. We went back to the hotel via La Garganta, stopping for a short while and finding a **Yellow-banded Skipper** on the roadside verge.

15th June 2022: El Pitolero, Jerte Valley, Casatejada

We checked-out of the hotel and headed south to the village of Cabezabellosa where we took a minor road to reach the summit of the mountain there, called El Pitolero. Here we had superb views of **Common Rock Thrush** and **Northern Wheatears**. From there we descended into the Jerte valley, the biggest cherry-producing region in Spain and duly bought two kilos of beautiful ripe cherries. We stopped in woodland near the Garganta de los Infiernos for a walk, finding a fine male **Copper Demoiselle**.

We had time for a final stop in the afternoon, near the village of Casatejada where we found **Violet Dropwings** beside a small pool. However, given the temperature was now 41°C we reckoned it was time to get back to Casa Rural El Recuerdo to enjoy a cold beer.

16th June 2022: Garciaz, Rice fields near Madrigalejo, Alcollarín Reservoir, Parque Principe at Cáceres

Today we focused on areas to the south and east of base. Our first stop was in the pine woods above Garciaz where we found **Sooty Coppers** and three species of gatekeepers. The view eastwards across to the Villuercas Mountains was superb. To the south we drove through barren fields which normally would be flooded and growing rice at this time, but because of the severe drought, all agricultural activity there had been suspended. We did find the *helice* form of **Clouded Yellow**.

At the nearby Alcollarín Reservoir we fared much better, with fantastic views of **Green Hooktails**, including a copulating pair, **Violet Dropwings** and enchanting groups of **Northern Banded Groundlings** which showed great curiosity as they approached us from patches of shade.

We then drove to Cáceres and paid a visit to the city park, Parque del Principe. This was superb. Obligingly good views of birds like **Iberian Magpies**, **Spotless Starlings** and **Hoopoes** and several of the newly arrived **Orange-winged Dropwings**. A very productive visit.

We then went to the car hire office for Koos to collect his car for use during his independent week.

24th June 2022: Return to Madrid with stop at Malpartida de Cáceres

After returning the car to Cáceres, we made a visit to small pools near Malpartida de Cáceres to check them for dragonflies. The cool weather made activity slow, but we did find several Small Spreadwings, which were new for the holiday. From there it was onward to Madrid, arriving as planned shortly after 14.00.

The tour was designed for butterflies and dragonflies, with the emphasis on good opportunities for photography, rather than achieving the biggest possible list of species.
