HOLIDAY REPORT

16th May 2022: Transfer from Madrid.

The flight from Gatwick was delayed so it was late afternoon when Claire and Harriet arrived to be met by Martin at Terminal One, Madrid airport. There was not a great deal of traffic on the ring-road. Soon we were leaving the city behind us, crossing the open landscape of Castille La Mancha on our way to Extremadura. We stopped about halfway for a meal and enjoyed seeing a brood of young Barn Swallows in the porch of the cafe.

Then it was a clear run through to Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

17th May 2022: Campo Lugar Plains, rice fields near Madrigalejo, Alcollarín Reservoir

Our first stop was the plains of Campo Lugar, a vast landscape with the grasses blonded by the onset of summer. We had great views of two Stone Curlew and a buoyant female Montagu's Harrier glided over the fields. Constantly, at every stop, was the song of Calandra Larks and Corn Buntings.

Our next stop took us to the edge of rice fields, where there was also rough pasture and scattered trees. An ideal habitat for the Black-winged Kite and we saw a pair perched in the top of a holm oak. There was an active Bee-eater colony and we also got excellent views of an Iberian Grey Shrike.

At a nearby river, Great Reed Warblers and Nightingales were singing, as well as a Melodious Warbler. Golden Orioles teased us from the poplars and Common Waxbills obliged us with good sightings in the reeds.

After coffee in the village of Campo Lugar, we spent the rest of the day beside the Alcollarín Reservoir. Amongst Great-crested Grebes there was a very fine, Black-necked Grebe in full breeding plumage. The Bee-eater colony at the entrance of the site was one of the most memorable parts of the whole holiday. We had a picnic next to a small pool, where there were Purple Heron and Great Reed warbler. During the afternoon, we enjoyed several good views of Woodchat Shrike and studied both Thekla and Crested Larks. As we left the area, we had the opportunity to watch at length a Rock Sparrow.

18th May 2022: Trujillo and Monfragüe National Park

We stopped first thing in Trujillo, beside the old grain silos to watch several Lesser Kestrels at their colony there. This was also a chance to see and compare Pallid and Common Swifts. From there we headed north, across the landscape of *dehesa* wood pasture, stretching to the horizon, broken only

eventually by our arrival at the rocky escarpments of Monfragüe National Park. Stopping at the viewpoint that looks across to the massive Peña Falcón rock, we had a very productive hour there.

All three species of vulture were present (Black, Griffon and Egyptian). Griffon Vultures had chicks on their nests, as did a pair of Black Storks. This gave us a wonderful view into their homelife. A pair of Peregrine soeared over the cliff top. Much closer to us was a superb array of smaller birds: Blue Rock Thrush, Black Redstart, Rock Bunting and Cirl Bunting. We also managed to get good views of two White-rumped Swifts.

From there we drove to the far end of the park for a coffee at a small hotel set amongst a cork oak grove. Here we saw Turtle Dove and Common Cuckoo, as well as Golden Oriole and heard Western Orphean Warbler singing.

After our picnic, we stopped briefly at a small lookout on the road that heads for Plasencia, where again we saw White-rumped Swift and Griffon Vultures with chicks in their nests. A wonderful view of a Thekla lark was granted to us at our next stop. We then walked in the shade beside the River Tagus, admiring the vast House martin colony on the road bridge, where there were also a few Alpine Swifts. In the wood, we had a brief view of a Two-tailed Pasha.



19th May 2022: Plains near Santa Marta de Magasca.

Onto the plains west of Trujillo first thing where we were rewarded by the amazing sight of a Great Bustard in full display, a perched adult Spanish Imperial Eagle, two or three Montagu's Harriers and some Pin-tailed and Black-

bellied Sandgrouse in flight. Again, it was perhaps the medley of larks and Corn Buntings which left the biggest impression. Further on, towards Cáceres, we saw several beautiful Rollers perched next to their nest boxes, as well as in flight, when the electric blue of their wings was revealed. We enjoyed watching Lesser Kestrels there too, as well as Short-toed Eagles, Griffon and Black Vultures. Next to the River Tamuja, Crag Martins and Red-rumped Swallows hawked insects.

After coffee in the charming little village of Santa Marta de Magasca, we headed to the River Almonte neat Jaraicejo for a picnic lunch, in the shade offered by a viewing point to contemplate the three bridges dating from 1450 to 1992 built at that point. Spanish Sparrows were busy nest-building on the oldest bridge.



On an evening walk, Claire and Harriet heard a Barn Owl in the olive groves, as well as a Tawny Owl.

20th May 2022 Walk near Pago de San Clemente, woods near Garciaz

Claire and Harriet enjoyed a walk around the village and surrounding lanes in the morning, with sightings of Hawfinch and Short-toed Treecreeper.



After lunch we escaped the heat by repairing to the hills above Garciaz. Here with the heady scent of pine and Gum Cistus, we found Broad-leaved Helleborine in flower and saw Dainty Damselflies and butterflies including Spanish Gatekeeper and Scarce Swallowtail.



21st May 2022: Transfer to Madrid airport

We bade farewell to Casa Rural El Recuerdo at 09.15 and with a stop for coffee halfway, arrived at Terminal 1 at precisely the planned for time at 12.20.
