17th June 2022: Pick-up Madrid and stop at Cuacos de Yuste, then onward to Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

TRIP REPORT

17th June 2022: Pick-up Madrid and stop at Cuacos de Yuste, then onward to Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

Martin welcomed Julie and Geoff back to Spain on their arrival at Madrid airport and we headed off immediately from the city to take the A5 motorway to Extremadura. We stopped for lunch near the village of Saucedilla and then visited the lower slopes of the Gredos Mountains in the La Vera region, parking beside the monastery of Yuste. We had an excellent walk along a quite road, surrounded by Pyrenean oak forest. Our first find was a magnificent **Stag Beetle** (sadly just demised), but butterflies such as **Spanish Purple Hairstreak** and **Southern White Admiral** were active. We were in the middle of a heatwave and when we paused near Saucedilla on our way onward to Casa Rural El Recuerdo, the temperature was 40° C.

18th June 2022: Garciaz

We had great views of **Hawfinches** feeding on dry Milk Thistle seed heads as we left the village. We drove the short distance up to the little village of Garciaz and then to the hill to the east. Here we had an excellent walk in the woodland there, surrounded by the scent of pines and seeing many butterflies including some gorgeous **Sooty Coppers** and **Great Banded Graylings** as well as a pretty **Clearwing** sp.

After an excellent coffee in the village we spent a couple of hours watching **Viperine Snakes**, damselflies, **Melodious Warblers** and **Woodchat Shrikes** from an old bridge over the River Garciaz.

Julie and Geoff then spent the rest of the afternoon enjoying watching a tame **Nightingale** in the garden.

19th June 2022: Campo Lugar plains and Alcollarín Reservoir

It was a much cooler and more cloudy day and ideal to start on the plains near campo Lugar. Here we had great views of **Stone Curlew**, **Black-bellied Sandgrouse** and **Collared Pratincoles**, as well as **Rollers** and a full gamut of larks. What was also outstanding were several examples of the antlion *Palpares hispanis*.

After coffee in Campo Lugar, we repaired to the Alcollarín Reservoir nearby where again we saw parties of **Collared Pratincoles** and hordes of **Northern Banded Groundlings** and several damselflies, including **Migrant** and **Small Spreadwing** and **Iberian Bluetails**.

20th June 2022: Trujillo Plains and River Almonte

Another cool day with a fresh wind, and just at the start of our day out we spotted a **Great Spotted Cuckoo** on the wire and managed to find a safe and legal place to park to watch it. In Trujillo we enjoyed watching **Pallid Swifts** flying to their nests to feed their highly vocal young. A warning light on the car was promptly dealt with at the garage, but gave us enough time to find an adult and recently fledged **Scops Owl** in a small park and to have a coffee.

We then spent time on the plains north of the town, engrossed by two species of bush cricket feeding on thistles. We had our picnic beside the Tozo River, watching a **Beeeater** colony where the tunnels were barely on any sort of gradient. The devoted the afternoon to a very pleasant walk beside the Almonte River, watching **Cirl Buntings** and families of **Woodchat Shrikes** and finding dragonflies such as **Long Skimmer** and **Violet Dropwing**.

21st June 2022: Castañar de Ibor

The summer solstice and another (or the same) **Great Spotted Cuckoo** seen as we headed off for the day. We made our first stop at the River Ibor where we enjoyed an excellent morning of dragonflies. Julie and Geoff were fortunate enough to see a **Splendid Cruiser** (a great find there) and we found two species of **Clubtail** (**Western** and **Yellow**).

In the garden of hotel where we had coffee, a **Geranium Bronze** was present. We had a picnic at a wonderful viewpoint affording a panorama across the lbor valley on to the rocky crags to the west.

The afternoon was devoted to walking on our favourite track up a small valley close to the town, surrounded by Sweet Chestnut and Pyrenean Oak where we found no fewer than 40 species of butterfly, including a gorgeous **Southern Scarce Swallowtail** and watched a pair of **Short-toed Eagles** in an apparent dispute with an immature bird.

22nd June: Plains west of Trujillo, Don Benito and Vegas Altas

It was a colder day and rather overcast and we started the day on the plains west of Trujillo where we saw both **Pin-tailed** and **Black-bellied Sandgrouse**, as well as a pair of **Stone Curlew** with chicks, **Montagu's Harrier** and **Spanish Imperial Eagle**. Hundreds of **Calandra Larks** were in flocks.

We then headed south, stopping to watch **Spoonbill** chicks in a heronry near Campo Lugar and then having coffee in the village. We stopped beside the Guadiana River near Don Benito where we obtained views of **Western Olivaceous Warbler**, **Little**

Bittern and **Purple Heron**, as well as dragonflies like **Violet Dropwing**. After lunch there, we spent the afternoon on the rice fields near Vegas Altas, seeing returning **Green Sandpipers** and **Northern Lapwing**, **Collared Pratincoles** and **Epaulet Skimmers**.

23rd June 2022: Cañamero, Puerto de Hospital, River Ibor

We spent most of the day in the southern end of the Villuercas Mountains, starting at a gorge along the River Ruercas where we had spectacular views of a family of **Bonelli's Eagles**, with **Golden Orioles** as an attractive supporting actor. Following coffee, we took the road into the Ibores Mountains, beyond the Puerto de Hospital to explore an area of Pyrenean oak woodland. This was full of **Western Bonelli's Warblers** and large number of **Iberian Marbled Whites**, which appeared as soon as the sun came out, all in magnificent scenery. On a quick check of the River Ibor afterwards, we found little dragonfly activity, it being a rather cool day.

24th June 2022: Free day

25th June 2022: La Garganta

We bade farewell to Casa Rural El Recuerdo and drove north to the border with Castille y Leon and above the little village of La Garganta, into a beautiful habitat of small meadows and woodland. Although it was rather cool and cloudy, it was brilliant for butterflies, the highlight being at least two of the mega-rare **Yellow-banded Skipper**, which we were not expecting to see. There were also a great selection of fritillaries and masses of **Iberian Marbled Whites**. Birds included a very fine male **Red-**

backed Shrike. All of this and we were surrounded by some incredible mountain scenery.

At the afternoon we checked into our hotel at the edge of the spa town of Baños de Montemayor.

26th June 2022: Las Mestas and Candelario

We drove an hour or so to the Hurdes region of Extremadura, to the Ladrillar valley, stopping first in the village of Las Mestas. We had hoped for a full morning of dragonflies, but perhaps because of the low temperatures first thing (6°C), there was very little activity, although we did see a **Western Spectre**. We checked another site further upstream, but apart from a **Large Pincertail**, there likewise was it fairly quiet, although we did see a **Dipper**. After our picnic we drove into the Sierra de Bejar, to stop on the mountainside above Candelario. This was superb for butterflies with numerous **Piedmont Ringlets** and **Chestnut Heaths** in the wing.

Birdwise too, we had brilliant views of several ${f Bluethroat}$, as well as ${f Iberian\ Dunnock}$ and ${f Ortolan\ Bunting}$.

Back at the hotel, a **Hobby** flew over as we enjoyed a pre-lunch dinner drink.

27th June 2022: Return to Madrid.

We checked out of the hotel and returned via Plasencia to the motorway to head back to Madrid. Plans for a final birding stop were thwarted by a damaged tyre, which was quickly replaced at nearby Navalmoral de la Mata. From there, we stopped for a bite to eat about halfway to Madrid and then despite a couple of hold-ups, got to the airport as planned.
