BIRDING EXTREMADURA AND CASA RURAL EL RECUERDO

BUTTERFLY AND HERPETOFAUNA SUMMER TOUR FOR MARK 3rd – 10th JUNE 2022

3rd June 2022: Pick-up Madrid and stop at Jaraiz de la Vera, then onward to Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

4th June 2022: Trujillo, River Ibor and Castañar de Ibor

5th June 2022: Trujillo, Puerto del Hospital (Ibor Mountains)

6th June 2022: Monfragüe National Park, Peña Francia and La Garganta

7th June 2022: La Garganta

8th June 2022: La Plataforma Gredos and Hoyos de Espino

9th June 2022: La Plataforma Gredos, Tormes River

10th June 2022: Southern slope of Gredos and return to Madrid.

TRIP REPORT

3rd June 2022: Pick-up Madrid and stop at Jaraiz de la Vera, then onward to Casa Rural El Recuerdo.

Mark arrived on time and we had a smooth run from the airport and onwards on the motorway heading south-west to Extremadura, with a stop for lunch at the half-way point. En route, we made a short detour to visit the Pyrenean oak woodland near Jaraiz de la Vera on the lower slopes of the Gredos Mountains to start our butterfly odyssey, with species such as **Ilex Hairstreak**, **Purple-shot Copper** and **Southern White Admiral** found. We then continued to Casa Rural El Recuerdo, arriving in time for dinner.

4th June 2022: River Ibor and Castañar de Ibor

A **Striped Hawkmoth** was feeding on honeysuckle close to the entrance of El Recuerdo as we left. We made a first stop at a pond near Trujillo to find **Western Spadefoot** toad (adults and many large tadpoles) and several medicinal leeches. We spent the day exploring the northern Ibor region, visiting first the River Ibor for dragonflies, seeing **Western Clubtail**, **Western Spectre** and **Orange-spotted Emerald**, as well as an **Otter**.

After a picnic with a fine view across to the mountains to the west, where we had a brief glimpse of a **Scarce Copper**, we spent an excellent afternoon in the small valley to the east of Castañar de Ibor. Here we were kept busy with butterflies, including **Amanda's Blue, Nettle-Tree Butterfly** and **Heath** and **Niobe Fritillary**.

5th June 2022: Puerto del Hospital (Ibor Mountains)

We returned to the Trujillo pond and added a group of **Sharp-ribbed Salamanders** to the list. Then onward again to the Ibores region, this time a little further south, to take the road over the Puerto de Hospital and then to a wonderful meadow, surrounded by Pyrenean oak and rocky crags.

Here we found a **Fiery Clearwing**, watched **Black-veined Whites** all to the sound of **Golden Orioles** and **Western Bonelli's Warblers**. A **Two-tailed Pasha** was found further along the road in an area of scrub dominated by Strawberry Trees.

6th June 2022: Monfragüe National Park, Peña Francia and La Garganta

We bade farewell to Casa Rural El Recuerdo and took the road north with a stop initially in the Monfragüe National Park to look for herpetofauna beside the River Tajo. We were rewarded by a huge female **Spiny Toad**. A great find! Onward then to the mountains and we briefly left Extremadura to ascend the park of Peña de Francia in Salamanca. Boasting a high monument and church, the peak not only offers superb views but also hosts an endemic rock lizard. After some searching, we obtained superb views of the **Peña de Francia Rock Lizard**, as well as a number of **Guadarrama Wall Lizards**. Birds included a colony of **Pallid Swifts** and **Common Rock Thrush**. **Spanish Ibex** were also present. **Honey Buzzards** were seen on the journey there.

From there we returned to Extremadura, checked-in to our hotel in Baños de Montemayor and then spent the evening above the village of La Garganta doing a reccy for the following day and staying on to dusk to enjoy the sound of churring **Eurasian Nightjars**.

7th June 2022: La Garganta

We dedicated the whole day to the montane meadows between La Garganta and Candelario, focusing on butterflies and on one species in particular: the near mythical **Yellow-banded Skipper**. This had been our target since 2019 and now armed with new intelligence on specific sites and spreading our search to drier parts of the meadows, where the food plant *Potentilla recta* was in flower, we encountered our first individual after just two hours of looking. It was unforgettable, seeing an unfamiliar silvery-grey butterfly flying over a metre above the vegetation in a direct flight. As soon as it settled, revealing itself as a large skipper with well-marked upper surface, we knew we had found the species. During the day we found it at two sites, seeing perhaps eight individuals and enjoying not just views of the gorgeous underwing, but also had time to watch territorial behaviour and what appeared to be pairs together.

We found other skippers too during our sojourn there including **Large Grizzled**, **Olive** and **Safflower**. Overall an amazing 41 species of butterfly were seen in an area of little more than two square kilometres.

We encountered as well a whole suite of birds not found at lower and drier altitudes in Extremadura, such as **Honey Buzzard**, **Red-backed Shrike**, **Firecrest**, **Coal Tit**, **Common Chiffchaff**, **Western Bonelli's Warblers** and **Common Whitethroats**.

We returned, elated, to the hotel to celebrate.

8th June 2022: La Plataforma Gredos and Hoyos de Espino

The day dawned misty with low cloud over the peaks, so we headed straight into the Gredos Mountains and drove up to the Plataforma near Hoyos del Espino. From there it was a twenty-minute walk across the beautiful moorland with singing **Ortolan Buntings**, **Eurasian Skylarks**, **Common Rock Thrush** and **Northern Wheatears** to a stream where we found **Iberian Stream Frog**. A family of **Black Redstarts** were also present there.

We then descended to the pines near Hoyos de Espino for a walk near the Tormes River. The weather meant that few butterflies were on the wing, but we did see two **Hobby** and later **Citril Finches** were seen near Navarredonda.

9th June 2022: La Plataforma Gredos, Tormes River

We were treated with wonderful weather so we returned to the Plataforma and found, on the way up, a **Lataste's Viper** on the edge of the road. At the Plataforma carpark we quickly located the sought-after **Cyren's Rock Lizard** and had excellent views.

Returning to the Tormes River we spent the rest of the day on several walks at various places in the valley, seeing a very satisfying range of butterflies, including **Glanville Fritillary**, **Provençal Orange-tip**, and **Mazarine Blues**, as well as **Common Wall Lizard**, **Guadarrama Wall Lizard** and both **Ocellated** and **Schreiber's Green Lizards**.

10th June 2022: Southern slope of Gredos and return to Madrid.

We checked out of the hotel and stopped initially at the Puerto de Pico to admire the colony of **Spanish Argus** on the *Erodium* there. Just down the hill, we made a short walk to find **Panoptes Blue**, the final butterfly of the trip. From there it was a couple of hours drive to the airport, which we reached by 13.00.

The tour was designed for butterflies and herpetofauna with specific focus on certain species, rather than aiming for a large species list. Dragonflies, birds and other wildlife were incidental.
