#### **TRIP REPORT**

# 19th March 2024: Pick-up at Madrid airport

Martin met Chas and Mary at Madrid airport and we set off at about 15.30 around the southern ring-road and then onto the motorway to Extremadura. A "calima" haze of Sahara dust blotted out distant views. We arrived late afternoon at Casa Rural El Recuerdo, ready for a welcoming meal.

#### 20th March 2024: Plains between Trujillo and Cáceres, Trujillo

The haze had largely cleared by morning and soon the sky was starting to look blue again! We explored the area between Trujillo and Cáceres, starting in the eastern part, hearing **Common Cuckoo** and seeing groups of **Pin-tailed Sandgrouse** in flight. It was our first encounter too with larks, so time to look at **Crested** and **Thekla Larks**, as well as soaking in the sound of **Calandra Larks** and **Corn Buntings**. A **Woodchat Shrike** (the first of several during the day) was also seen.

Moving further west, we saw rather distantly a group of eight **Great Bustards** and also a **Shorttoed Eagle**. Taking a dirt track, we saw several **Greater Short-toed Larks**. **Lesser Kestrels** hovered over the meadows. We saw a "ring-tail" harrier settle in tall vegetation and waited for it to reappear. As it flew out, it offered us a sideways view. Examination of the photos of the bird showed that it was indeed a second-year **Pallid Harrier**.



It was now time for a well-deserved coffee, so we repaired to Santa Marta de Magasca. Here **House Martins** were busy nest-building. We then had our picnic overlooking the River Tamuja, where we had excellent views of a **Spanish Imperial Eagle**. We continued afterwards on the

plains north of the village, stopping for a walk on an old drovers' trail. Here there were four species of orchid in flower (Bug, Mirror, Sawfly and Champagne), whilst just down the road there was also a stand of Pink Butterfly orchids. We stopped at the granite boulder landscape north of Trujilo, watching bright Spanish Sparrows and a Thekla Lark singing on a stone wall.



Entering Trujillo we saw a roosting **Scops Owl** in a small square and then visited the area near the Bull Ring, just as a **Booted Eagle** came by which upset the nesting **Lesser Kestrels** there. We had superb views of both species.



# 21<sup>st</sup> March 2024: Campo Lugar plains, Sierra Brava Reservoir, the rice fields and Alcollarín Reservoir

There had been distant thunder during the night, but the day dawned clear, albeit with a strong, gusty breeze.



We headed south, past Zorita and onto the plains near Campo Lugar. Here we were enthralled for an hour watching **Great Bustards**, especially two rival males, who, in perfect light, proceeded to face-off and then entered an argy-bargy scrum. Females nearby were seemingly uninterested, whilst another male was in full display further away in the field. Other birds took a second place to this spectacle, but we also saw **Little Owl**, **Greater Short-toed Lark**, lots of **Calandra Larks** and **Corn Buntings**. Eventually the two males parted company and strode away. That was our cue to move on, and we stopped at the Sierra Brava dam where **Crag Martins** were hawking insects. Nearby we had another memorable encounter for the day, with a wonderful display of decoy behaviour by a **Great Spotted Cuckoo** as it twisted and turned in flight to entice a pair of **Magpies** away from their nest. Meanwhile a female was trying to enter the bush, sometimes spotted by the furious **Magpies**. It was a tremendous insight into the daily life of this species as it seeks to find hosts.



We had coffee in Madrigalejo and then drove across the rice fields. The windy conditions were not conducive to finding small birds and most of the fields were empty, but we did find three **Greater Flamingos**, a **Spoonbill**, **Tree Sparrows**, a **Northern Wheatear** and some very smart **Yellow Wagtails** of two subspecies (the Iberian and the Blue-headed).

We then moved on to our picnic beside the Alcollarín Reservoir, where we spent the rest of the day. **Spoonbills** fed at the edge of the water and **Great Crested Grebes** were in courtship. There was a remarkable number of **Woodchat Shrikes** present (double figures) and a large flock of **Ravens**. **Marsh Harriers** were busy in courtship, and we saw both **Short-toed** and **Bonelli's Eagles**, the latter carrying a prey item.

Waterfowl and waders were also present on the reservoir. The former included **Pintail**, **Gadwall**, **Wigeon** and **Shoveler**, and the latter **Spotted Redshank**, **Greenshank**, **Redshank** and **Ruff**. Amongst the flotilla of **Common Coot**, we refound a **Red-knobbed Coot** which had been found by Martin a few days earlier. We had good views of this local rarity.

## 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2024: Belén Plains and Monfragüe National Park

The strong south-easterly wind continued for most of the day, bringing with it a shroud of haze of Sahara dust. There was some sunshine in the afternoon, and it felt very warm all day.

We spent the first part of the morning on the plains east and north of Trujillo, but sadly no Little Bustard was located, even at the spot that Martin had heard one two days previously. However, once again we were immersed in lark song and we had an interesting encounter on one of the drovers' trails with a movement of a herd of cattle, complete with two farm workers on horseback.

Then we headed north through a seemingly endless landscape of *dehesa*, stopping at Torrejón El Rubio for coffee and thence to the Monfragüe National Park. We stopped first at the iconic Salto de Gitano viewpoint, looking onwards to the immense quartzite cliff of Peña Falcon, where we did indeed see a pair of **Peregrine Falcons**, involving a food pass from male to female. We also had wonderful views of two pairs of **Black Storks**, wheeling around, calling and landing at their respective nests (one of which it was possible to see an egg). **Griffon**, **Black** and **Egyptian Vultures** were also present, as well as **Blue Rock Thrush**.




Crossing the Tagus River, several **Alpine Swifts** were flying around the bridge. We had our picnic at the Tajadilla viewpoint, seeing a male **Black-eared Wheatear** as we approached, and where as well as the vultures, we had lovely views of several **Siskins** and a **Blue Rock Thrush**. From there we stopped at the Portilla del Tiétar where the highlight was a **Rock Bunting** singing on a rocky outcrop. Returning to the Tajadilla, we found and had prolonged views of a male **Hawfinch**, feeding on elm seeds. Two **Red Deer** were also seen en route.

We moved to the Puerto de Serrana viewpoint, where a **Subalpine Warbler** gave us good views and we watched a pair of **Egyptian Vultures** perched on a rock. By then it was time to make our way back to base.

#### 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2024: Return to Madrid

After all too short a stay it was time to bid farewell to Casa Rural El Recuerdo and return to Madrid. But not before some final birding at the Arrocampo Reservoir. The hazy calima had returned but there was little wind, so the viewing conditions across the marsh at Saucedilla were good. As soon as we had stopped we heard a **Savi's Warbler**, which we located and watched. About half a dozen **Purple Herons** were seen, in flight and also perched. There were

also **Cattle** and **Little Egret** present. A group of **Glossy Ibis** was seen. On our way to the second stop, we saw a **Sparrowhawk** being mobbed by Barn Swallows, and some roosting **Black-crowned Night Herons** were present.



It was time to set off for the airport, which we reached just after 12.30, with a coffee-stop halfway on the journey. The traffic entering Madrid was very light, in contrast to the very heavy holiday traffic leaving.
